
To play my role with a heart that sings,



Richards, Sr. At the age of 19 he enlisted in the army where he became a jeep driving instructor, bugler, and assistant company clerk. Later he volunteered for parachute training. He was sent overseas where he participated in battles/campaigns in North Africa, Sicily, Salerno, Naples, Foggio,

Normandy, Holland Ardennes, and Rhineland. In the Holland campaign he was awarded the Silver Star, which is the third highest medal given for gallantry. When he returned after the war, he headed for a career as a veterinarian. Due to a very definite call from God, he changed direction and studied for the ministry. He began his youth ministries with John Hancock and was one of the pioneers of the Pathfinder Club. Much of his career was spent in youth ministries. His later career years were as a chaplain with the San Diego Navy and Marine Corps. He married Linda in 1984 and retired here in the Oakhurst area. During his years here he served as a valuable contributing member of the Oakhurst Church, elder, speaker, trumpet player. We look forward to being with him again in that wonderful world made new. Linda, we pray for God's continued blessing and guidance in your life as you make this difficult transition.
